**Educator Course: People of New York**  
**Summer 2020 - Zoom Schedule**

*People of New York* is an online course that runs from July 6, 2020 through July 31, 2020. The course is broken into 7 modules that each involve both synchronous and asynchronous learning.

This schedule provides dates and times for the synchronous online sessions. Zoom links for each session will be emailed out to participants in advance of the session dates. Attendance at live sessions is a key component of this course.

Mon, July 6 10am-12pm	Introductory Session: Building Community & Setting Goals	We will introduce the main themes of our course, set community guidelines together, and review our schedule.
Wed, July 8 10am-12pm	The Origins of the <i>Hidden Voices</i> Project	These sessions focus on <i>Hidden Voices: Untold Stories of New York City History</i> . We will learn best practices for using this resource and discuss how foregrounding hidden voices deepens our understanding of the past.
Thurs, July 9 10am-12pm	Workshop: Teaching with the <i>Hidden Voices</i> Curriculum	
Mon, July 13 10am-12pm	Guest Lecture: The People of <i>City/Game: Basketball in New York</i>	Drawing upon the MCNY exhibition <i>City/Game: Basketball in New York</i> , we will consider how basketball's history illuminates a multitude of New York stories and can facilitate student engagement.
Wed, July 15 10am-12pm	Workshop: Unpacking the Census, Then and Now	Drawing upon the MCNY exhibition <i>Who We Are: Visualizing NYC by the Numbers</i> , we will learn how educators, scholars, and artists use data to showcase the stakes and consequences of being represented and counted in our city.
Thurs, July 16 10am-12pm	Workshop: Data Visualization in the Classroom	
Mon, July 20 10am-12pm	Guest Lecture: Curating Stories in <i>Activist New York</i>	We will explore <i>Activist New York</i> , an MCNY online exhibition focused on the history of the individuals and communities that have fought to shape our city's future.

Wed, July 22 10am-12pm	Guided Discussion: Interviews from the BHS Oral History Collection	We will engage with the practice and uses of oral history, particularly for centering the experiences of individuals in the past. We will learn how to use interviews as primary sources and how to guide students through the practice of creating their own oral histories.
Thurs, July 23 10am-12pm	Workshop: Guidelines & Best Practices for Creating Oral Histories	
Mon, July 27 10am-12pm	Concluding Discussion: What Do the People of New York Tell Us	In this final module, we will reflect on the stories we've uncovered, the skills we've learned, and the power of individual experience as a lens for understanding our past, present, and future. Participants will have the opportunity to share and receive feedback on a draft lesson plan.
