47th Annual Museum Mile Festival

Free Activities and Access to Participating Museums

New York, NY (May 28, 2025) - Eight museums and several neighborhood partners are once again coming together for the 47th annual Museum Mile Festival, New York City's biggest block party, which will take place, rain or shine, on **Tuesday, June 10, from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.**

Presented as part of *Founded By NYC*, the citywide commemoration of the 400th anniversary of New York's founding as a municipality, this celebration of art and culture will feature live programs, musical performances, exhibitions, and art-making activities for all ages, as well as additional events. Festival attendees can walk Museum Mile on Fifth Avenue between 82nd Street and 110th Street while visiting eight of New York City's finest cultural institutions, all of which will be **open to the public with free admission** throughout the event.

The museums participating in this long-standing collaboration are: The Metropolitan Museum of Art; Neue Galerie New York; Guggenheim New York; Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum; The Jewish Museum; Museum of the City of New York; El Museo del Barrio; and The Africa Center.

The Church of the Heavenly Rest, the New York Academy of Medicine, The Asia Society, AKC Museum of the Dog, the Institute for the Study of the Ancient World, the New York City Civic Engagement People's Bus, and 92NY will also participate in the festival as neighborhood partners.

The Museum Mile Festival's **opening ceremony** takes place at **5:45 p.m.** at the **Museum of the City of New York** (1220 Fifth Avenue). Audiences can share the festivities using #MuseumMileFestival on Instagram, Facebook, Threads, and X throughout the evening.

Highlights of events and offerings presented by the museum partners:

The Metropolitan Museum of Art (82nd Street)

Kick off your summer at The Met and celebrate 400 Years of New York. Create art, catch a performance, and check out our current exhibitions, including the newly opened *P.S. Art: Celebrating the Creative Spirit of New York City Kids*.

Neue Galerie New York (86th Street)

Neue Galerie New York will be open to the public free of charge from 6 to 9 p.m., offering access to the galleries. *Austrian Masterworks from the Neue Galerie* is on view. The <u>Book Store</u> and <u>Design Shop</u> will remain open late, too!

Guggenheim New York (89th Street)

Guggenheim New York will host a series of outdoor activities on Fifth Ave including family art-making, leaf rubbings, street tree identification, and sidewalk water painting tied to its current exhibition, *Rashid Johnson: A Poem for Deep Thinkers*. Inside the museum, there will be access to all exhibitions as well as live piano performances activating Johnson's *Sanguine*.

Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum (91st Street)

Cooper Hewitt invites attendees to explore its current exhibition, <u>Making Home—Smithsonian</u> <u>Design Triennial</u>. Installed throughout the Andrew and Louise Carnegie Mansion, the exhibition features 25 commissions that illustrate the ways design is embedded in contemporary life. Inspired by the exhibition and the 400th anniversary of the founding of New York City, the museum will host a drawing activity about the places, people and things that make the city home.

The Jewish Museum (92nd Street)

The Jewish Museum presents the exhibitions, <u>Ben Shahn, On Nonconformity</u> and <u>The Book of Esther in the Age of Rembrandt</u>. Outside on Fifth Avenue Frank London's Klezmer Brass Allstars will perform high-energy Eastern European Yiddish music, klezmer, and a family art activity will be offered, Mini Poster Designs inspired by striking works in the Ben Shahn exhibition.

Museum of the City of New York (103rd-104th Streets)

Celebrate NYC's 400th anniversary at the Museum of the City of New York with art, history, and hands-on fun for all ages. Enjoy exhibitions like <u>Above Ground: Art from the Martin Wong Graffiti Collection</u> and <u>Urban Stomp: Dreams & Defiance on the Dance Floor</u>, plus outdoor activities on Fifth Avenue—from street games and Bhangra dance to crafts, mapping, and artifact exploration. Featuring bilingual programming, live music, and family-friendly workshops, it's a vibrant tribute to the city's past, present, and future.

El Museo del Barrio (104 - 105th Street)

Join El Museo del Barrio for music, art making and free access to current exhibitions, <u>Mestre Didi:</u> <u>Spiritual Form and Candida Alvarez: Circle, Point, Hoop.</u> El Museo will be joined by East Harlem organizations to celebrate the arts & culture that come from our lively neighborhood. Listen to music all night long by DJ, Chiquita Brujita, and make your own artwork with Museo educators to explore the colorful world of Candida Alvarez! RSVP here.

The Africa Center (110th Street)

The Africa Center is proud to present <u>Sarah Elawad's When the War is Over</u>. An exhibition that will transform the Center's Fifth Avenue windows, *When the War is Over* offers a powerful and poetic visual statement that engages passersby in a conversation about culture, memory, and resilience, and related to the current conflict in Sudan. Inside the Center, visitors can explore the photography exhibition <u>Between Nostalgia & Dreams</u>, by Yusuf Ahmed. The Africa Center's celebration will also feature live music by <u>Alsarah and the Nubatones</u>.
