

## The Museum of the City of New York Museum Announces the Return of Gingerbread NYC: The Great Borough Bake-Off

New York, NY (September 15, 2025) — The Museum of the City of New York (MCNY) announces the return of its holiday tradition, *Gingerbread NYC: The Great Borough Bake-Off*, opening to the public on Friday, November 7, 2025.

Now in its **fourth year**, this beloved seasonal exhibition invites **professional and amateur bakers** from across the five boroughs to submit designs for edible creations that celebrate the city's iconic places, buildings, and spirit—rendered entirely in gingerbread.

The theme, "**Iconic New York**," invites participants to reimagine a building, place, or thing that represents the heart of their neighborhood, community, or borough. From brownstones and bridges to bodegas and ballparks, no symbol of New York is too big—or too sweet—to tackle.

A panel of distinguished judges—including Magnolia Bakery's Bobbie Lloyd, restaurateur Melba Wilson, and The Metropolitan Museum of Art's Nadine Orenstein—will review the final gingerbread displays and award prizes in multiple categories. Museum visitors will also help crown the "People's Choice" winner by casting their votes during the run of the exhibition.
